Kirk Stevens – I am the co-owner of Big Motors – a car and truck dealership. Martina and Nick buy their company cars from us. *Dress suggestions:* Wear overalls as if you just came out of the pit. Wear a cap.

Phoebe Watkins – I am the general manager of SDX TV. Rosemary Piper and Freya Walker work for me. I like golf. *Dress suggestions:* Wear very stylish clothes and carry a golf club and/or some golf balls.

Reece McTavish – I am a computer hacker. I am friends with Glenda Drake. *Dress suggestions:* Wear casual clothes and carry a laptop (or a cut-out of one in cardboard).

 - What were you doing at the time of Santa’s murder?
- 6 Ask witnesses and Santa’s helpers the following questions:
 - What have you seen or heard?
 - What do you know about the suspects?
 - Is there anything you would like the authorities to know?
